

Things to bring

Please bring:

- 1. All your x-rays or scans
- 2. Your medications
- 3. Toiletries and clothing
- 4. Health fund & Medicare details

It's a good idea to leave your jewellery at home. Please remove all rings, especially if you are having hand surgery.

Do not operate machinery or a vehicle within 24 hours of your anaesthetic as your ability is impaired, and it is illegal.

You must tell Dr Coll about any blood thinning medication when you book your surgery.

Please arrange for a responsible adult to collect you from hospital

In order for your anaesthetic to be safe, it is vital that you have no food or drink for 6 hours before your surgery. You may take your usual morning medications with a small sip of water.



After your operation

You must contact the rooms if any of the following occur:

Persistent bleeding
Excessive swelling
Your affected part changes colour or has
Pins & needles or numbness
Pain unrelieved by your prescribed medication
Offensive discharge from the dressing
Fever or chills

Smoking increases your risk of death whilst under anaesthetic, causes wound infections, worsens scars, causes increased pain and slows healing.

Do not take Aspirin, Warfarin or Clopidogrel (Plavix) after your surgery without telling Dr Coll. Resting quietly, effectively reduces your pain.

Paracetamol 4 times a day, also reduces your pain. Do not exceed the recommended dose. Children require a smaller dose as is written on the packet.

Gently move your fingers and toes to prevent the formation of clots in your arms or legs. Deep breaths will prevent clots in your lungs.

Please attend your physiotherapist or hand therapist if prescribed in your operative handout. They will advise you regarding appropriate activities and use of your affected body part.

Removal of your sutures will occur at your next appointment.

Every effort is made to ensure your surgery is safe

How do I speed my recovery?

Try to rest for 24 hours after your surgery, this will reduce bleeding and pain. Elevate the affected body part. You can apply ice for 20 minutes at a time to ease your pain. Avoid pressure on or rubbing of the affected part. Keep your wound clean and dry for 5 days. Use crutches or slings as prescribed. Avoid alcohol and cigarettes after surgery.
